Drug and alcohol abuse prevention program information:

DRUGS, ALCOHOL, AND TOBACCO

Since Scripture admonishes us to refrain from harmful practices, Corban students may not use, possess, manufacture, distribute, or disperse tobacco (including chewing tobacco), alcoholic beverages or illegal drugs while associated with the University (I Corinthians 6:19-20, 10:31, Proverbs 20:1). The University may refuse admission to applicants who evidence difficulties in these areas. Current students who exhibit such problems may be asked to submit to (and pay for) testing, searches, counseling and/or disciplinary action which could include dismissal from the university. Corban is in compliance with federal drug-free campus and workplace legislation.

A student goes about being accepted back into Corban after being dismissed because of a drug or alcohol abuse problem, our practice is to outline (in writing) steps that they must follow in order to be considered for readmission. Also, if a student applies for re-admission, the admissions committee would ask them to provide verification that these steps have been fulfilled.
