In a science lab on infectious diseases, the professor asked the students to consider and discuss how, as health professionals, God would want them to compassionately treat patients with diseases contracted through ungodly lifestyles—a real-life application. Wow! So different from our own secular college experience!

As a science major, our oldest son, Scott, ultimately turned down a campus with more impressive laboratory facilities and chose Corban because he saw how the Corban professors believe in the authority of Scripture as the basis for all things in life, including academics and science. Corban stands apart from almost all Christian universities in this aspect, we were surprised to learn.

Scott graduated from Corban in 2012 and now attends WSU Veterinary School. He is an enthusiastic alumnus and would recommend Corban in a heartbeat. Our most insecure child, his first year away from home was a bit challenging, but he liked being at Corban and the awesome
