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International Student Application Instructions

Corban welcomes your application, and we will carefully review it, along with each of your references, transcripts and test scores. We are committed to a policy of non-discrimination with regard to race, color, national origin, sex, age or disability.

How to apply

Complete this Application for Admission. Be sure to read and fill out the application carefully and completely. Include the autobiographical essay and sign your completed application.
Applications for the fall semester must be submitted by April 1st. Applications for the spring semester must be submitted by October 1st. Note: If you are a citizen of the United States, you may not need to complete the International Student Application. Contact Corban to request the correct forms.
Submit a money order for \$40 U.S. dollars as your non-refundable application fee. (Do not send cash.)
Ask your pastor or church leader to complete and return the Christian Character Reference form to Corban. Do not have relatives complete it. If you are related to this person, ask another member of the pastoral staff or member of the church board to complete the reference.
Obtain personal reference. The reference should be filled out by an employer, teacher, business person, counselor or other adult who has known you for at least a year. Do not have relatives complete it.
Submit official transcripts from each secondary and post-secondary school attended. Transcripts in languages other than English must be accompanied by a certified English copy and an evaluation by World Education Services (www.wes.org).
If English is not your native language, submit your scores for the Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL) or for the International English Language Testing System (IELTS) to Corban. For admission, we require a TOEFL score of at least 52O paper-based or 7O internet-based or an IELTS score of 6. If you choose to take the SAT or ACT test instead of the TOEFL or IELTS, the minimum score is 9OO for the SAT (critical reading plus math) or 19 composite score for the ACT.
Corban requires all international students to provide certification of adequate financial support. An Immigration and Naturalization Services I-2O will not be released until you have been accepted for admission, paid the \$1,000 deposit and have submitted the completed Statement of Financial Responsibility. The \$1,000 non-refundable deposit is due by May 1 for fall semester and December 1 for spring semester.
Submit a photocopy of your passport with your application.

CORBAN LIFESTYLE RESPONSIBILITIES
As a Christian university, Corban is committed to providing a Christian education for life and service. It is our conviction that learning and the Christian faith are inseparable. We are committed to the Bible as our standard of faith and practice. We believe that the Christian life is positive rather than negative. We also believe, however, that it is in the best interest of the University to be specific with respect to certain standards.
Corban students are responsible to refrain from practices that are biblically condemned. In addition, students are responsible for upholding behavioral standards that promote a community atmosphere conducive to growth. These require a Corban student to abstain from sexual impurity as well as the possession and use of federally-recognized illegal drugs. Responsible use of alcohol and tobacco is permitted off-campus and only by students of legal age (21 for alcohol and 18 for tobacco). Students are responsible to use care in their choice of entertainment and to refrain from all morally degrading aspects of the theater, entertainment media and literature. Corban students are also responsible for being faithful in church, chapel and class attendance.
All accepted applicants will be supplied with a Student Handbook and asked at registration to sign a contract agreeing to abide by the standards of the University. It is suggested that you read the handbook carefully before enrolling. While it is recognized that some may not have personal convictions wholly in accord with these responsibilities and standards, the purposes and ideals underlying necessitate the student's willingness to modify his or her own personal conduct while under the jurisdiction of the University, fully understanding that this is in the best interest of the academic community he or she has chosen to join.
