Position Description:

Position Begins: July 1, 2015
Salary: Commensurate with qualifications and experience
Responsibilities: Principal responsibility is teaching Christian ministry courses that primarily equip women for ministry. Course load focuses on undergraduate courses, though some graduate teaching may be involved. Other duties include academic advising, curriculum development, and university and departmental committee work. Corban University faculty are expected to be active scholars, excellent teachers, active in service to the university and the community, and able to model the integration of faith and learning.

Qualifications:

Education: Doctorate in the field of ministry from a regionally-accredited or Association of Theological Schools institution is strongly preferred. The successful candidate without a doctorate will be expected to complete a doctoral program.

Experience: Significant experience in ministry, especially in training women who are emerging adults, is required. Broad ministry experience including church, parachurch, intercultural and community, is strongly preferred. Undergraduate teaching experience is also preferred.

Skills: Demonstrated teaching ability, leadership skills, and current technology aptitude are required. Online teaching, publication and overseas ministry experience are plusses. Finalists will be required to submit a theology, philosophy and methodology of ministry statement to the School of Ministry.

Character: Faculty candidates must have a personal relationship with Jesus Christ and evidence a mature Christian faith. Candidate must also have an exemplary marriage and family life. Candidate must agree by conviction with the University's statement of faith, be committed to the integration of biblical principles in their teaching and be willing to invest themselves in the development of their students. Candidate should also evidence good relationship skills necessary to function effectively on the School of Ministry team.

Application:

Applicants should submit a letter of application, curriculum vitae, transcripts, a brief testimony and statement of current ministry involvement, three letters of recommendation and a completed Corban faculty application.
