Conduct of Officials

- All intramural officials working for the Intramural Department are students who have expressed a desire to assist the program in this capacity. Intramural referees are paid and will have received prior referee training.
- 2. Intramural officials are to read ALL of the rules designated to the specific sport prior to the first competition.
- 3. Officials are to sign the code of conduct and liability waiver, this shows that they will do their job to the best of their ability, if the act of refereeing is cause of an injury Corban University is not liable, and that they understand the rules that apply to the designated sport.
- 4. Officials must be available to attend the meetings as required by the intramurals supervisors.
- 5. Intramural officials will do their best to keep the games running on time, enjoyable, and fair.
- 6. Officials are responsible to make sure the teams pray together prior to competition.
- 7. Per any competitive or recreational activity, officials may be asked to provide brief rules to the teams prior to the start of each game/activity.
- 8. Officials are responsible for their surroundings therefore they must feel the environment is safe to play in and refrain from ANY distractions deemed unnecessary by the onsite supervisor.

Conduct of Participants

"...whatever you do, do it all for the glory of God." 1 Cor. 10:31

- A major part of the philosophy of the Intramural Department is that good sportsmanship is essential for every contestant. In order to encourage proper conduct during games, officials, supervisors, and administrators shall make decisions on whether to warn, penalize, or eject players or teams for poor sportsmanship.
- 2. The Intramural Department adheres to the conduct policies described in the student handbook.
- 3. All participants MUST sign the intramural code of conduct and liability waiver form BEFORE participating in any sport or activity. This will be strictly enforced.

- 4. It is highly encouraged that all participants read the rules of each sport before competing for understanding and if needed direct questions to intramurals supervisor for clarification.
- 5. The presiding official or supervisor may disqualify any participant whom they feel is physically, mentally, or emotionally unable to participate.
- 6. Any act or misconduct, physical or verbal, is grounds for ejection from participation in intramural activities at the discretion of the referee and/or intramurals supervisor. This pertains to teams as well as individuals.
- 7. Ejected players will immediately be suspended from all intramural activity. In order to be granted rights to participate the player must meet with the Intramural Director to discuss future participation. (Incidents will be documented.)

Participation and Sign-ups

- 1. Any Corban student, faculty, staff, or alumni is eligible to participate in the Intramural Department.
- 2. Team Rosters are due on the listed due date to the intramurals coordinators or to the Intramural office. Additions or corrections need to be communicated and cleared through the intramurals office (Gym office).
- 3. Current intercollegiate athletes must have clearance through their coaches to participate in any intramural activity.
- 4. Any student, faculty, staff, or alumni participant who has participated in a sport professionally is barred from that sporting activity.
- 5. Information regarding activity dates and information times can be obtained from; student e-mail, the Intramural website, the Corban Toilet Paper, posters, or from the Intramural office.
- 6. A maximum of two varsity athletes per team are allowed to play their sport, but must first have permission from their coaches, athletic trainers, and intramural supervisors (ie- No more than two Varsity Men's Basketball players would be allowed to play on one particular team). If you have the maximum number of sport specific varsity athletes on your team, you are allowed only one other non-sport specific Corban athlete. (includes current and former athletes)

2 Sport Specific Corban Athletes + 1 Non-Sport Specific Corban Athlete 1 Sport Specific Corban Athlete + Unlimited Non-Sport Specific Corban Athletes

Insurance and Accident Policy

All participants are to read and agree to the terms before participating in intramural events. The terms state:

"In signing this contract I recognize that Corban University provides no insurance coverage or payment for medical expenses for students who sustain injuries while participating in intramural sports. I recognize there are inherent risks of injury when participating in intramural sports and waive and release Corban University from any and all claims or demands for damages or injury, known or unknown, that I may have against Corban University as a result of participating in intramural sports. I agree to assure and pay all my own medical and emergency expenses in the event of accident, illness or other incapacity occurring while participating in intramurals. I also agree that I am responsible to observe any physical restrictions indicted by a physician."

Forfeits

The team requirements for number of players are listed on the roster sheet for that specific sport. If teams fail to meet the minimum number of players needed by the time it is ten minutes into the scheduled time of play, that team must forfeit.

If your team absolutely needs to forfeit a game, then Captains are responsible to notify the Director of Intramurals well in advance before the event.

FORFEIT RULE: Any team who forfeits two games in the same season will be dropped from further participation in the league. NO EXCEPTIONS WILL BE MADE

Protests

- 1. All protests must be in writing and submitted to the Intramurals office within 24 hours of the competition of the contest. A duplicate copy must also be delivered to the opponent's captain.
- Protests may be made on the playing of an ineligible player or when interpretation of the rules is at fault. Under no circumstances will an official's judgment be grounds for a protest.

- Both contestants and/or team captains shall be permitted to present their version of the case before a decision is final. Final decisions will be determined by the Intramurals Director and their committee of chosen employees and students. Decisions made by the committee are final.
- 4. All protests will be decided on the basis of fairness to the individuals or teams concerned and the best interest of intramural competition in the sport involved.

Inclement Weather

Decisions will be made 2 hours prior to the start of the event. Games will be played as scheduled if it is safe for participants and staff members and if the facilities used will not be damaged. If the conditions change during play, the supervisor will determine if games will continue or be rescheduled. Captains are responsible for keeping their team up to date on any game cancelations.

Sport Specific Rules

The specific league and/or game rules provided for each specific sport will be posted on the Intramural website, as well as available in the Intramural office.

Equipment

- 1. Sports equipment will be provided when possible, but students are required to furnish their own personal equipment.
- Safety equipment may be required; this equipment will be identified in the league rules. The safety of our participants is our top priority. Safety equipment may include but is not limited to shin guards, mouth guards, etc.
- 3. Footwear for all contests is mandatory unless otherwise stated and should follow these guidelines:

<u>Indoor Activities:</u> No street shoes, outdoor cleats or black-sole shoes <u>Outdoor Activities:</u> Only rubber-molded cleats or tennis shoes may be worn. Absolutely NO metal or metal screw-in spikes allowed.

4. Teams are encouraged to wear matching shirt colors to all contests for easy identification.

Jewelry

Corban University Intramural Department encourages participants and staff to remove all jewelry prior to involvement in any activity. Jewelry that is deemed dangerous to themselves or others will have to be removed in order to participate. If the jewelry cannot be removed, concealed, or secured in a manner safe for the participant, they will not be able to compete. Questions may be directed to the Intramural Director, but staff at the event are required to make the decision on-site using their training and judgment.

Team Captains

Each team is required to select the best possible person as Captain. A Captain must assume the role of liaison between the Intramural office and their team to ensure that good sportsmanship will be exhibited by all participants, players, captains, and fans alike. Each captain will have the following responsibilities:

- 1. Acquaint themselves and team members with the intramural policies and the specific league and/or game rules.
- Attend all required meeting for the league including the Captain's Meeting prior to the season. (If the Team Captain is unable to attend the meeting a representative may attend in their place.) If no representative attends the Captains Meeting, the team will be dropped from the league.
- 3. Ensure that all members of his/her team are eligible for participation.
- Assure his/her team is ready for play at all scheduled game dates, times, and locations. This includes notifying team members of changes made to the league schedule for any regular or post season games.
- 5. Be responsible for the conduct of their players on and off the Intramural playing field.
- 6. Choose an appropriate name for their team that is free from derogatory terms or innuendos. The Intramural supervisors will review all team names for inappropriate content. If a name is found to be inappropriate, a new name must be chosen or the team will be recognized by an assigned name.
- 7. Contact team members in the event of a cancelation.
- 8. Attend all captains meetings.
- 9. Ensure that your team roster has the required minimum players signed up before the first game.
- 10. Remind your players that they play at their own risk.
- 11. Ensure that your players are playing on only ONE team or it will result in forfeit or loss of player eligibility.

- 12. Notify your players that team schedules, rules, waivers, and any other Intramural information can be found on the Intramural website or in the Intramural office.
- As Captain you have the right to protest a questionable rule interpretation or situation. Refer to the section on "Protests" on pg. 9
- 14. If your team absolutely needs to forfeit a game, then Captains are responsible to call or E-mail the Director of Intramurals. (503-375-7588 or dzavala@corban.edu)
