BIBLICAL EDUCATION: 18 semester hours Biblical Education requirement: *Not available at Clark College*

Prorated based on transferrable hours:

0-44 quarter hours transferred credits = 18 semester credits required of Biblical Education

45 quarter hours transferred credits = 15 semester credits required of Biblical Education

90 quarter hours transferred credits = 12 semester credits required of Biblical Education

Notes:

1. 60 semester hours (90 quarter credits) is the maximum number of hours that can be transferred from Clark College to Corban.
2. After acceptance to the University, all students will receive a transcript evaluation before the first term of attendance. The application fee is non-refundable.
3. Students transferring with less than 47 quarter units of college work must qualify for admission on the basis of SAT or ACT scores and academic transcripts from both high school and colleges attended.
4. Only course work with a C- or better will be accepted. Classes receiving a "P" grade will only be transferrable if the passing grade is equivalent to a "C-" or higher.
5. Courses numbered below 100 are not generally accepted by Corban University.
6. A Christian Character Reference is strongly considered for admission to Corban University.
7. The Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) should be submitted between January 1 and February 15 to receive priority consideration for fall term.
8. When converting quarter hours into semester hours, multiply by .667.

***Humanities:**

Courses in the humanities study culture and various expressions of human creativity. The humanities as a subject area include literature, art, music, religions, philosophy, rhetoric, and linguistics. Such courses are intended to introduce students to key concepts, methodologies and terminologies in given fields. Performance courses do not apply.

****Social Sciences:**

Courses in the Social Sciences encompass anthropology, political science, psychology, sociology, macro/micro economics, child and adolescent development, music history, cultural geography, and specific criminal justice courses.

*****General Education:**

General education curriculum consists of coursework in the disciplines of Bible, communications, humanities, history, human performance, math, science and social science.
