MATHEMATICS: This pool accepts applications for potential openings for part-time instructors (adjuncts) that may arise throughout the year, and is not a guarantee of an open position. Adjuncts for the Program of Mathematics have historically taught sections of MA123 (College Algebra), MA133 (Pre-Calculus), and MA223 (Statistics and Probability).

QUALIFICATIONS AND REQUIREMENTS:

Education: A master's degree in Mathematics or completion of at least 27 graduate quarter hours (or 18 semester hours) in Mathematics or a related field. Applicants with a master's degree in Mathematics Education will be considered.

ESSENTIAL DUTIES:

- Develop course schedules and syllabi.
- Identify and meet the mathematics learning needs of students.
- Perform Biblical Integration in line with Corban's Statement of Faith.
- Develop and administer formative and summative assessment instruments for students' progress and competence.
- Work closely and maintain consistent communication with the Program Director of Mathematics.

Character: The candidate must have a personal relationship with Jesus Christ and evidence a mature Christian faith, be in agreement with the University's Statement of Faith, and be committed to the integration of biblical principles within the discipline of mathematics.
