Step 2. Student (and Spouse's) Income Information—Calendar Year 2023:

- Student (and spouse) successfully used the IRS Direct Data Exchange (FA-DDX)** to transfer their 2023 IRS tax return information.
- If FA-DDX does not bring information in**, student (and spouse) will provide a **signed copy** of their **2023 federal tax return** or a copy of their **2023 tax return transcript** (and 1040X if an amended return was filed). *See below for instructions.
- Student (and/or spouse) will not, and is not required** to, file a **2023 federal tax return**. If so, **submit copies of any 2023 W-2s you received.**

***IMPORTANT:** If the FA-DDX does not successfully show that a students (or spouses) did not file a 2023 federal tax return then the student (and spouse) must submit **proof of non-filing from the IRS**. Follow the instructions below, but request a "Verification of Non-filing Letter" for 2023 (under # 3).

Three ways to submit 2023 federal tax information are:

1. **Easiest Method: IRS Direct Data Exchange (FA-DDX)** Log into the student's, or spouse's, 2025-2026 FAFSA at fafsa.gov. Navigate to the financial information section. You will see a place to give consent to use the FA-DDX. Click it. Enter your information **exactly** as it appears on your 2023 federal tax return and hit "submit". Check the box by "Transfer my Tax Information into the FAFSA" and click the "Transfer Now" button. For your protection, your tax information will not be displayed. Remember to electronically sign and submit the FAFSA again using your personal FSA ID and password.
2. **2nd Most Common: Signed copy of you, (and spouse), 2023 federal tax return.** Please sign the tax return even if you submitted it electronically. Include Schedules 1, 2, and 3, if required to file them. **Bring in, mail or fax a copy to our office, see front page.**
3. **IRS Tax Return Transcript (Required in Some Situation):** Go to <https://www.irs.gov/individuals/get-transcript>. Select either "Get Transcript Online" or "Get Transcript by Mail". Be sure to request the Tax Return Transcript for 2023. **If a Non-filer request form Form 4506-T on the same IRS website. Please put the student's name on the transcript or form. Bring in, mail, or fax the Transcript to our office, see front page.**

If your marital status is currently married of living together, you will need to **provide** this information for both **you AND them**. This is true even if you were unmarried in 2023 when you filed your taxes.
